## **Minutes**

## **Water Fund Financial Report**

On a motion from Douglas Cosby, seconded by Joel Kriner, the May 2025 Water Fund Financial Report was approved as submitted. Vote 5-0

## **Water Department Report**

Water Superintendent, Adam Boswell, was not present. Mayor, Danny Morcom, said that we have plenty of water right now. There has been over 11 ½ inches of rain in May alone. Council member, Joel Kriner, asked how the new water meter reading was going. Training is scheduled tomorrow, Friday, June 20<sup>th</sup> from 9 am to 1 pm.

## **Fire Department**

The Arnoldsville Fire Chief, Heath Baker, was not present. Douglas Cosby said that they had been busy from the storm on Saturday, due to trees being down. Monday a gas line was struck by Spectrum on Dudley Farm Road.

The fundraising letters went out and they are doing well with the responses. Also, they are expecting quotes next week on the additions to the fire department building.

**Zoning**

Land Use/Zoning Officer Lynn Shedd reported that it was quiet right now, but he did have one inspection.

**New Business**

Mayor, Danny Morcom, said there was one resident who asked if they needed a permit for a band they were having play on July 4<sup>th</sup>. The resident was told that we do not give out permits, but that Oglethorpe County has a noise ordinance of 11:00 pm. Also, the resident was sent our ordinance §6-1-7.4 Noise It shall be unlawful for any person to create or assist in creating, permit, or continue any unreasonably loud, disturbing, or unnecessary noise in the City. Noise of such character, intensity, and duration that is detrimental to the reasonable comfort, health, or life of any individual is prohibited. The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing, and unnecessary noises that constitute a public nuisance in violation of this Ordinance, and which shall be abated. (d) The use or operation of any musical instrument, radio, loud speaker, or sound amplifying device so loudly as to disturb persons in the vicinity thereof. The resident thanked us for letting him know.


**Old Business**
